




Waste sorting and recycling for household

Sorting at home

 <p>Compostable</p>	 <p>Paper and cardboard</p>	 <p>Glass- and metal packaging</p>	 <p>Garbage</p>	 <p>Plastic packaging</p>
<p>For food that cannot be eaten, paper towel with food waste on it, coffee grinds, tea bags (Nylon bags should be in garbage), eggshells and other food waste without wrapping.</p> 	<p>All kinds of cardboard and paper, both writing paper, newspapers, Beverage cardboard, flyers, packaging, and paper filler.</p> 	<p>Clean glass and metal of any foodstuffs.</p> 	<p>Garbage is what is left when you have removed anything that could be sorted into other bins. For example, diapers, vacuum cleaner bags, tobacco, and contaminated plastic.</p> 	<p>Plastic packaging is a plastic that has wrapped food and other items.</p> 
<p>Food waste goes exclusively in green bags. Tie the bag with two knots and put in the bin.</p>	<p>Juice and milk cartons should be rinsed with cold water and drip-dried.</p>	<p>Rinse with cold water and air-dry. Put the glass and metal in the bin as is.</p>	<p>Place in a regular plastic bag, tie with a knot to avoid spilling.</p>	<p>Put these items in the clear plastic sack. Rinse with cold water and put them in the bag as is.</p>
